# Private Healthcare

Bahrain's Private Healthcare sector covers a wide range of businesses including hospitals, rehabilitation centers, dental clinics and others regulated by the National Health Regulatory Authority (NHRA). The sector's gross value added declined by 10.7% from 2021 to 2022, however Bahrain's private healthcare is predicted to bounce back with the opening a number of hospitals and care centers.

## Sector Opportunities & Trends

### **O1. Telemedicine and virtual care**

In 2020, Bahrain issued its first telemedicine license and guidelines to enable virtual consultations to take place through licensed medical practitioners in the Kingdom. Telemedicine and virtual care are likely to increase due to patient expectations and the rise of new delivery models. Bahrain's virtual care sector will get a boost when the process of including the country in the network of Saudi Arabia's SEHA Virtual Hospital, the first in the Middle East, is complete. The cooperation will strengthen healthcare between the two countries in many related fields, such as health insurance, medical research, emerging diseases and knowledge exchange.

### **02. Geriatric care**

With a rising aging population, the demand for geriatric services is expected to grow. Although the geriatrics care industry is at a nascent stage in Bahrain and the GCC, it is expected to develop as a non-medical specialty in the coming years in line with global trends.

### 04. Preventive healthcare

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Preventive care aims to nip illnesses in the bud and keep more people healthy by promoting health and wellness measures such as regular checkups and screenings as well as push for healthy lifestyle changes such as exercising and healthy eating.

### 05. Public-Private Partnership

Public-private partnerships could improve the delivery of healthcare services and reduce wait times for medical treatments offered by public hospitals. In turn, private hospitals can benefit commercially from public hospital referrals.

### **03. Mental healthcare**

The NHRA in 2020 introduced a governing framework aimed at institutionalizing the treatment and delivery of mental care in Bahrain, effectively extending a hand of support to mental health patients. There is a need for rehabilitation centers to provide a safe, supportive environment for people to recover from addiction and other mental health issues such as anxiety and post-trauma stress.

Introducing long-term care facilities for patients will help ease hospital bed occupancy rates. There is also a need for rehabilitation centers to provide a safe, supportive environment for people to recover from injuries, addictions and other mental health issues.

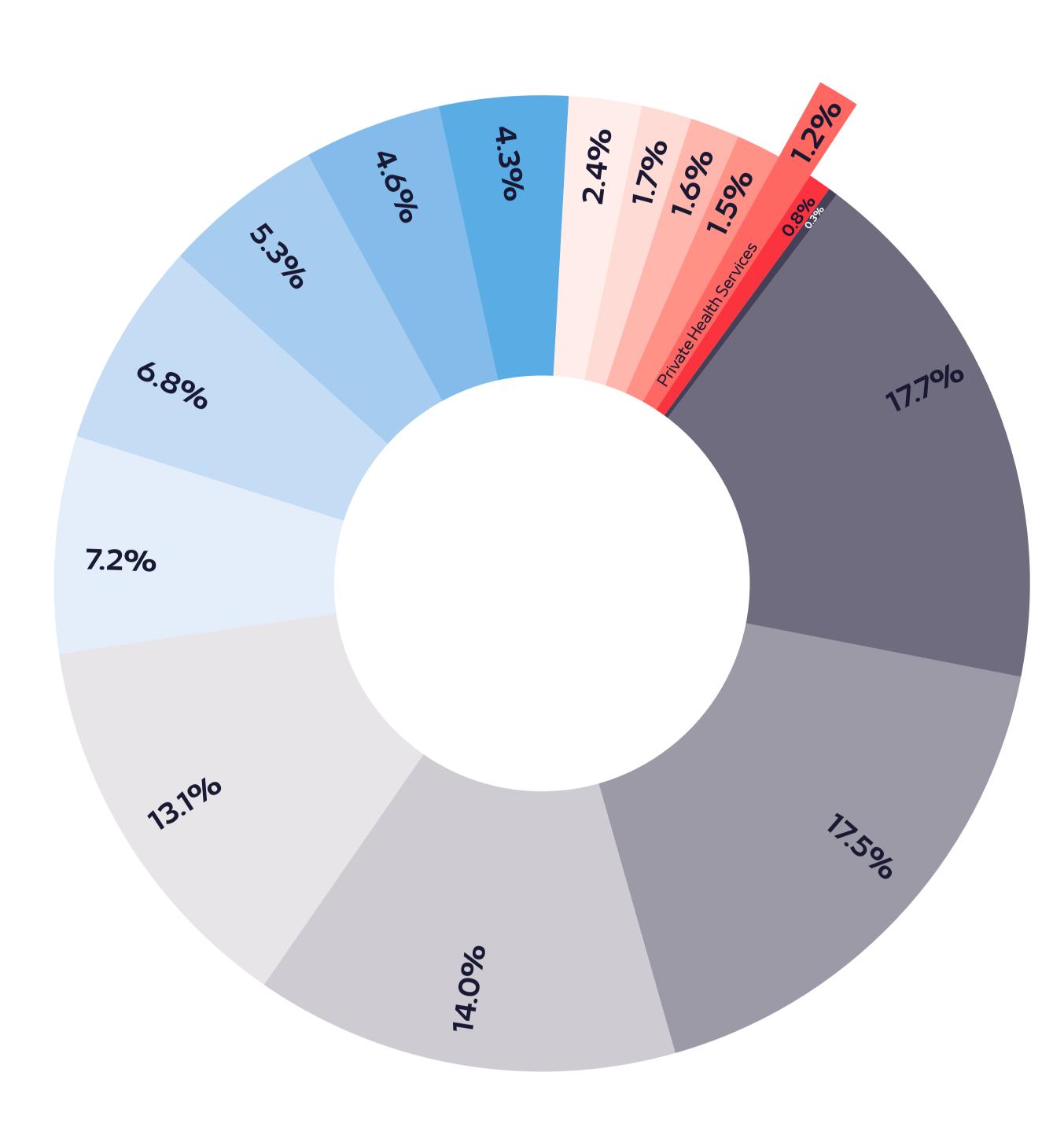
### **07. Medical tourism**

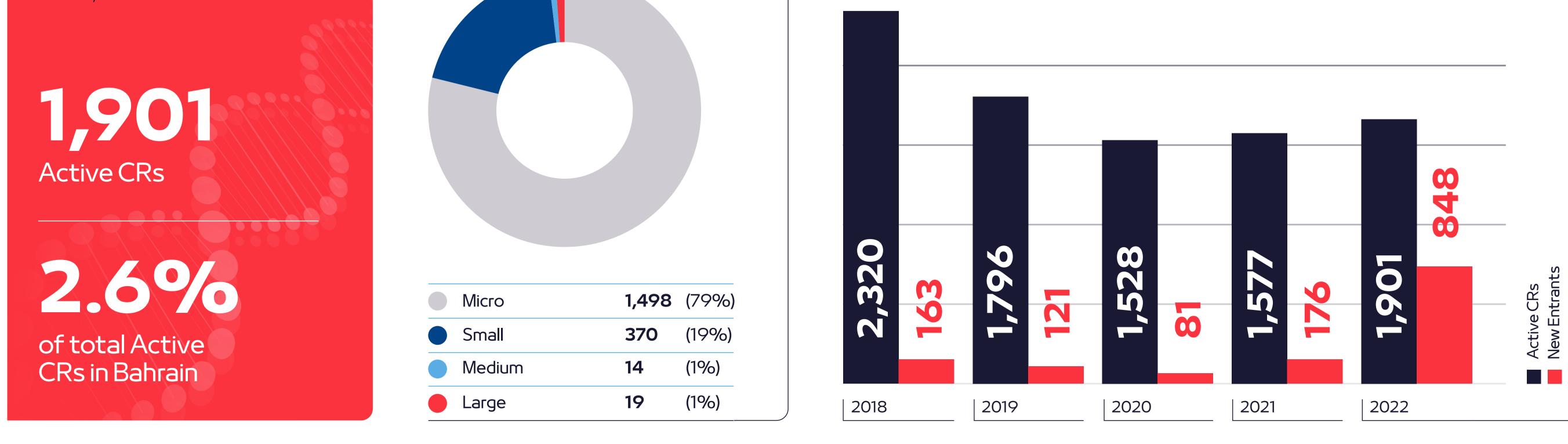

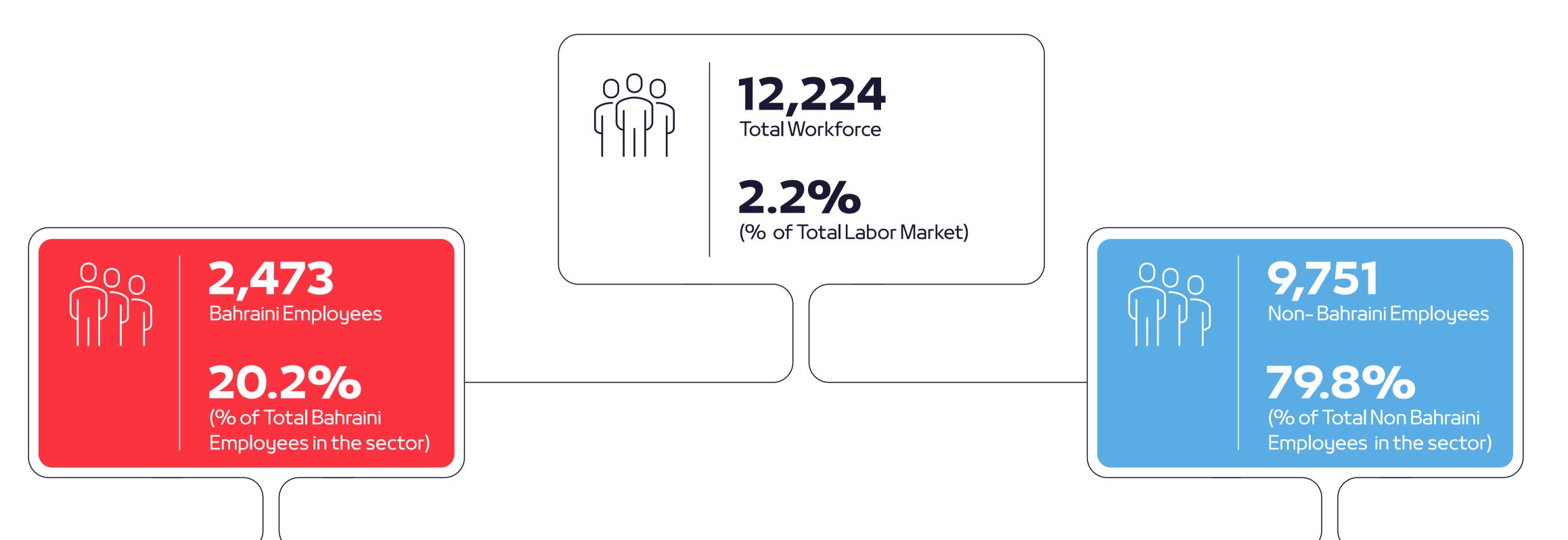

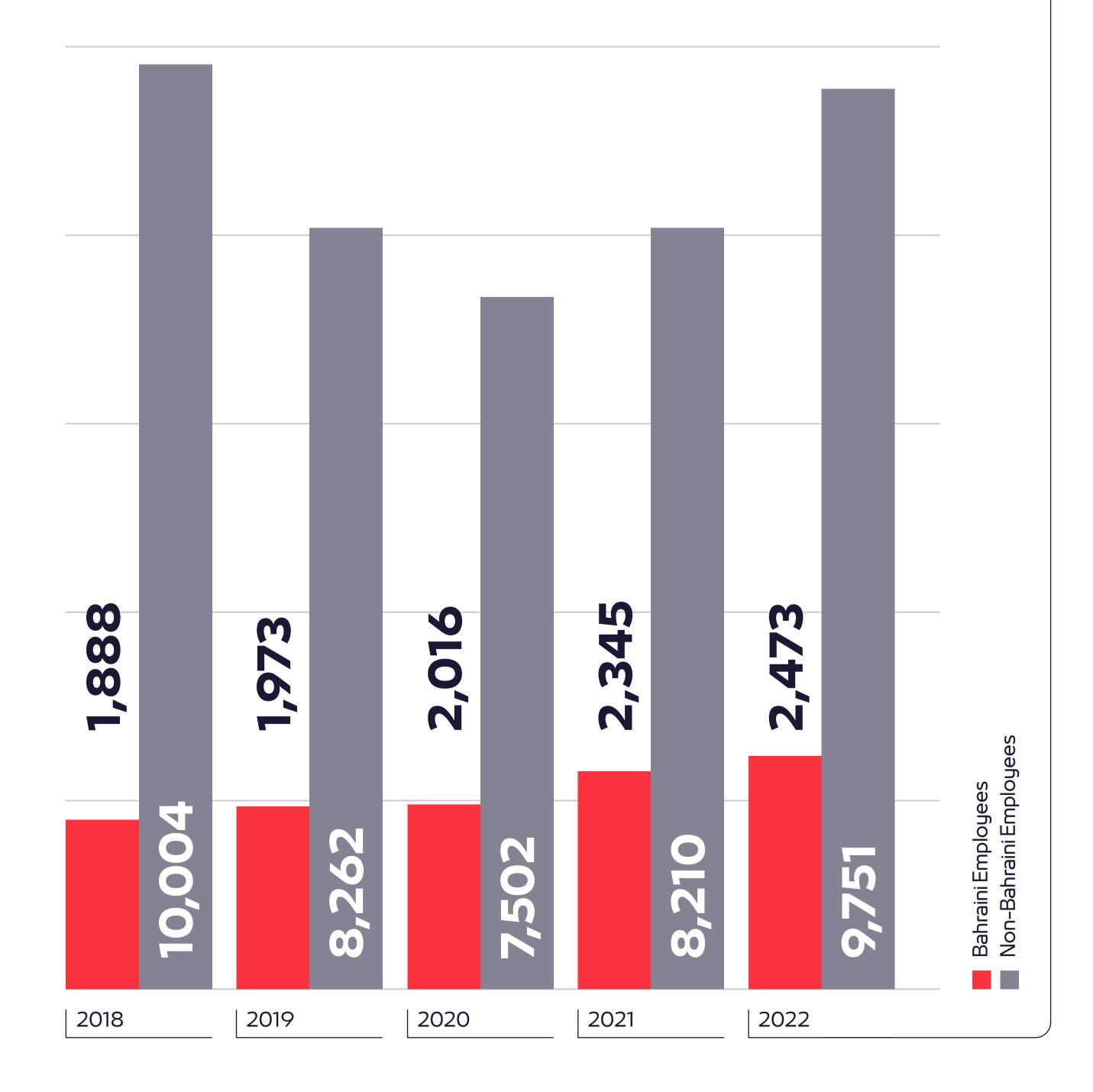




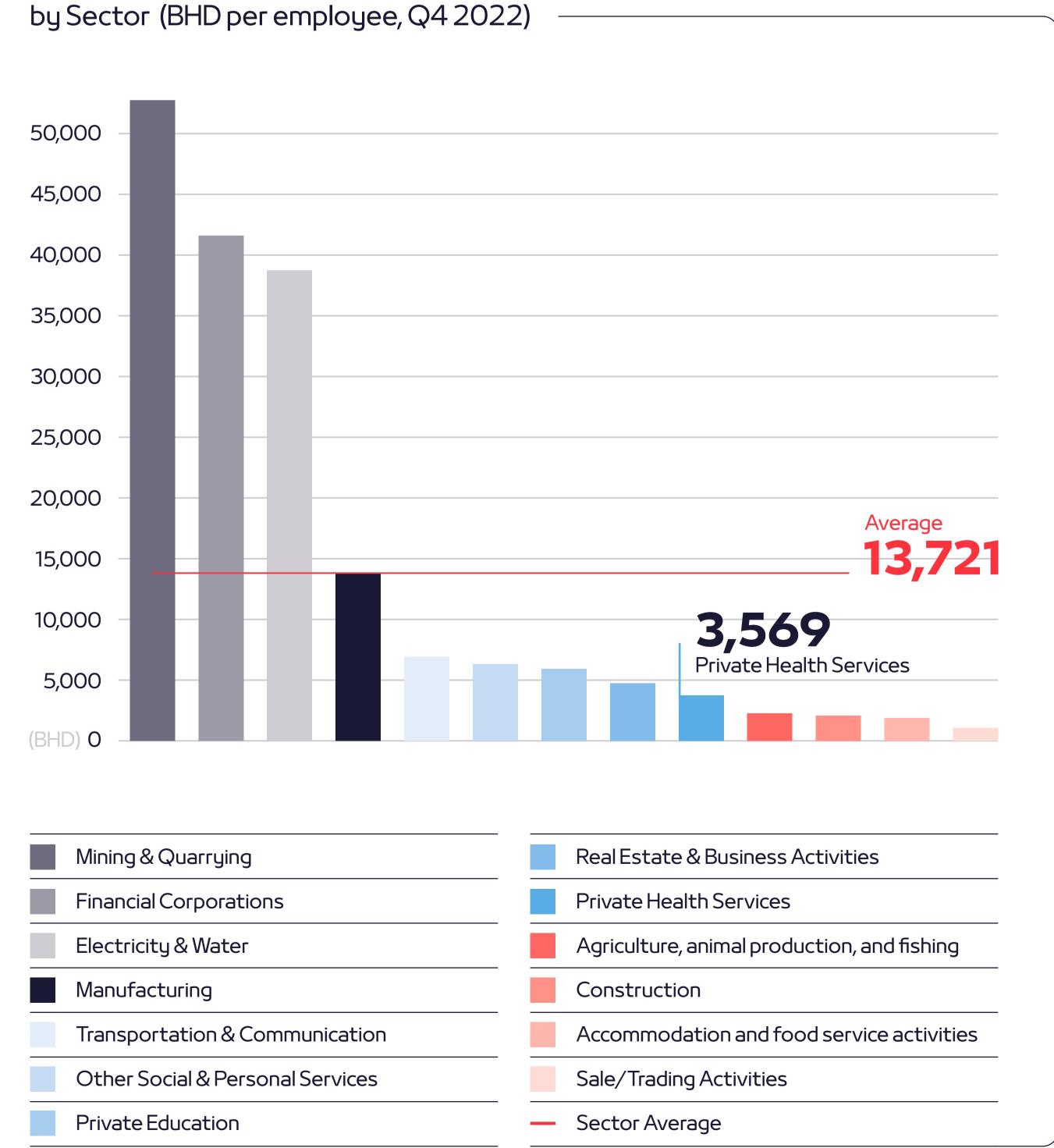


#### Private Healthcare Sector Growth in Employees
